This study will look at the care provided to patients aged 18 and over, with a diagnosis of endometriosis. The clinical review part of the study is reviewing remediable factors in the quality of care provided across the whole care pathway. The organisational questionnaire is looking at the organisational structures in place to provide care to patients with endometriosis, and where there may be room for improvement in the service.
