The National Confidential Enquiry into Patient Outcome and Death (NCEPOD) is a charity which works to make healthcare services better for the people who use them.



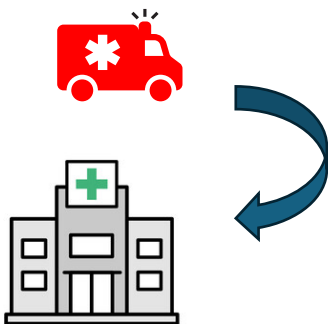
Our work has led to lots of good changes in how healthcare is provided.

1st July – 30th September 2024

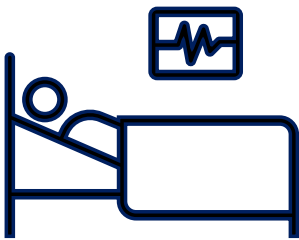


We are collecting information to see how care can be improved in the future for patients with a learning disability who must stay in a hospital when they are unwell. They may have taken an ambulance to hospital.

What are we collecting?



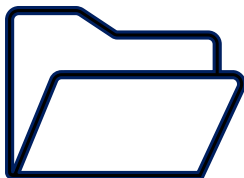
We are asking doctors their thoughts on how to improve care for patients with a learning disability during a hospital admission.



We are asking patients and carers their thoughts on the care received when admitted to hospital

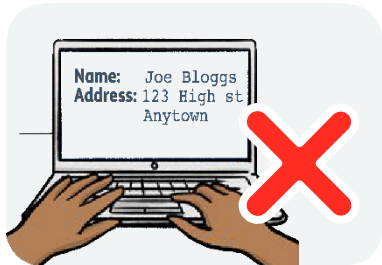


A survey will also be open to healthcare professionals to ask for their opinions on training and delivery of care
